STRUCTURE OF THE UNIVERSITY

Šibenik University of Applied Sciences is a Higher Education Institution established by the Resolution of the Croatian government in 2006. The University is an independent higher education institution headed by a Dean and a team of three Vice Deans. Each of the latter is responsible for a different area of institutions life such as student's issues and management. Professors appointed as heads of the study year assist students with various issues.

Students have access to the best standards of studying ranging from students` dormitory, library to the new restaurant, psychological and career development counselling. Furthermore, they can participate in sport activities and competitions in the country and worldwide. It is especially important to stress that they can participate in the work of all bodies and committees of the University through the Student union.

These are the competences that students are expected to have after successfully finishing their studies at the University:

UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES:

— TOURISM MANAGEMENT

During the studies students acquire the knowledge, skills and competences related to the management of small and medium-sized enterprises, strategic planning and destination management, management of hotels, resorts, travel agencies, development and implementation of marketing strategies, financial and accounting management, the introduction of international quality standards, positioning the company or tourist entity on the market, human resources management. Students will be able to perform everything mentioned in a responsible manner, taking into account the environment in which the company exists through legitimate businesses and respect for human rights.

— ADMINISTRATIVE LAW

Students will be trained to work in public administration with the usage of modern administrative knowledge and skills that provide highly educated staff in bodies of state and local administration and public services. This department's program provides essential administrative education for managing complex legal issues in both private and public spheres. It educates experts in public administration at the baccalaureate level.

- TRAFFIC

The programme of undergraduate study in Traffic is oriented towards professional requests of engineers in traffic. The study offers technical, technological and organizational education necessary for conducting traffic processes, management of equipment and materials, practical application of modern technologies in the organization of transport with the aim of reaching optimal technical, technological and economical effects with protection of environment. The basic aim of education is to define and analyze theoretical, technical, technological and practical solutions of contemporary transport technologies and systems, logistics of optimal solutions in traffic processes which consequently all make a base for successful realization of traffic processes.

ISVU is the information system for all higher education institutions in Croatia. You will need it when applying for exams. The instructions for you will be provided at the University.

— NURSING -

Upon completing the this program, graduates will be proficient in implementing nursing practice based on a solid foundation in anatomy, physiology, biology, and other biomedical fields. They will adeptly apply professional, ethical, and legislative regulations while embracing holistic care principles. Graduates will excel in assessing patients holistically, collecting and interpreting data, and formulating nursing diagnoses. Their competencies include planning, applying, and evaluating individualized health care collaboratively with patients, families, and healthcare professionals. Graduates will contribute to health promotion, possess critical judgment skills for evidence-based practice, and effectively utilize communication and modern technology in healthcare contexts. Furthermore, graduates will actively participate in projects aimed at improving nursing practice standards, demonstrating leadership in education and resource management within the dynamic healthcare environment.

— BUSINESS INFORMATICS

The Professional Business Informatics program is designed to prepare students for managerial roles in IT business systems over six semesters. Graduates acquire a diverse skill set, including problem-solving, critical thinking, and proficiency in oral and written business communication. Specific competences focus on departmental and process management, IT project management, database design, and effective communication using information technology. These competences, combined with a consideration of human, financial, legal, and technological factors, prepare graduates for successful professional tasks in the dynamic field of business informatics.



These are the competences that students are expected to have after successfully finishing their studies at the University:

GRADUATE STUDIES:

- MANAGEMENT

The Graduate Study Programme in Management cultivates skilled managers for diverse business systems. Competences encompass problem-solving, analytical thinking, independent learning, teamwork, and effective communication. Specific skills include departmental management, strategic planning, marketing, financial analysis, risk management, and legal considerations within a dynamic economic and technological framework. The program's outcomes cover leadership, research, probabilistic models, business strategy, conflict resolution, economic interpretation, legal application, and investment project assessment, along with proficiency in simulation software, market research, and financial markets navigation.

— ADMINISTRATIVE LAW

The aim of this study program is to qualitatively improve public administration experts and public sector professionals in general by introducing new additional knowledge and skills through specialization. The foundation of modern public administration is a well-educated and competent

personnel. It is therefore necessary to approach education of those whose degree of education, but also competences that arise from it will meet the needs and public administration tasks in Croatia. With the completion of the specialist graduate study program Administrative Law, undergraduate students acquire basic theoretical, methodological and applicative knowledge in the field of law, branch of administrative law as well as in the field of economics, information technology, communication sciences, ethics and foreign languages. Students will also build competences of independent management, performing entrusted tasks and critical review of their work.

LANGUAGE POLICY

Minimum academic and language qualification of exchange students:

Students must have completed at least 1 year of academic study or be in the 3rd semester as Bachelor students. The required level of English Language Proficiency is B1 level of CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference). All kinds of language certificates are accepted. If you do not have a certificate, testing will be organized at our institution at the beginning of a semester.

English courses

The University predominantly has lectures in Croatian language. For the purposes of the incoming international mobilities we can offer study programmes taught in English.

For information on the ECTS value please contact the ERASMUS coordinator.









Support

The University arranges full mentoring and peer support for incoming students who will be contacted personally by the ECTS and Erasmus coordinators prior to their arrival in Croatia.

They will be guided during the application procedures at the University and in other arrangements that are helpful in their preparations (applying for visas, responding to official bodies for their residence registration, accommodation facilities, etc.).

Each student will be appointed to a teacher mentor who will be responsible for supporting and evaluating academic achievements of a student. One person from our staff will be responsible for dealing with requirements of international students.





REGULATING YOUR STAY IN CROATIA

If you have come from abroad for the purpose of study, you should first request a personal tax number (OIB) at the Central Tax Administration (Porezna uprava). This number will be issued immediately and it is free of charge.

You only have to bring your passport and the form available on this <u>link</u>. Don't worry, in this process you will be helped and guided by the institution's coordinator.



INFORMATION ON THE VISA SYSTEM IN CROATIA

EU citizens

non-EU citizens

MOBILITY PERIOD SHORTER THAN 90 DAYS -

Since Croatian accession to the European Union, EU citizens are no longer obliged either to apply for the approval for temporary stay or to register their address if they are staying in the Republic of Croatia shorter than 90 days.

Upon your arrival in Croatia, within 48 hours you have to register your address in Croatia at the Foreigners' Office of the relevant Police Administration Office (Odsjek za strance, Policijska uprava). For scholarship holders who are staying at student dormitories (or hotels) the address is automatically registered.

MOBILITY PERIOD LONGER THAN 90 DAYS

EU citizens who plan to study in the Republic of Croatia for more than 90 days are obliged to apply for the registration of temporary stay for the purpose of studies (Prijava privremenog boravka za državljane članice EGP-a) - in order to obtain a certificate on reporting temporary stay. You should submit your application for the issuance of the certificate on reporting temporary stay within 90 days of your arrival in Croatia at the Foreigners' Department of the local Police Administration Office (Odsjek za strance, Policijska uprava). Please find below the list of required documents and addresses of local police administration offices.

Non-EU citizens staying in the Republic of Croatia for more than 90 days are obliged to apply for the issuance of the approval of temporary stay for the purpose of studies within 90 days of the arrival at the Foreigners' Office of the relevant Police Administration Office (Odsjek za strance, Policijska uprava).

Administration fee

You are exempt from paying the regular administrative fee approximately 46,45 EUR for granting the approval of temporary stay. However, you should cover the cost of the issuance of the biometric residence card in the amount of 31,85 EUR (59,73 EUR under the accelerated procedure). An additional administrative fee in the amount of 9,29 EUR has to be paid for the issuance of a biometric residence card either to the IBAN code of the state budget or in revenue stamps. **Find out more on the link.**

EU/EEA nationals who plan to stay longer than 3 months (e.g., for the purpose of study or traineeship) have to register their temporary stay (<u>Application Form 1b</u>) at the police administration according to their place of stay.

Students who are third-country nationals are obliged to request approval for temporary stay if they will be staying longer than 90 days in Croatia. A third-country national needs to register his/her residence and address within 3 days from entering the Republic of Croatia at the local Police Administration Office (policijska uprava, odjel za strance ili policijska postaja).


This procedure is free of charge.

The Agency will prepare a proof of secured board and sufficient funds for living expenses, a document which proves that you are a scholarship holder in Croatia from the Agency for Mobility and EU Programmes (so-called Uvjerenje). Upon your arrival, you can obtain it from your mentor at the host institution.

Health services

International students in Croatia must possess valid health insurance for their stay to obtain a residence permit or temporary stay approval. EU/EEA/Swiss nationals can use the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC), while those enrolled in full-degree programs can transfer their healthcare from their home countries. More information on terms of using healthcare in Croatia is available on the Croatian Health Insurance Fund (CHIF) website.

Third-country nationals from specific countries with bilateral agreements with Croatia should obtain necessary documents from their health insurance providers.

All other third-country nationals must have comprehensive private health insurance, travel health insurance, or Croatian health insurance for their stay. For further details, you can contact the National Contact Point (NCP).

CROATIAN STUDENT ID CARD "IKSICA"

As an international student of the Šibenik University of Applied Sciences, your are advised to apply for a student ID card (the X-ica card) after your arrival. You will be helped in the process by the Student Administration Office in student "referada". Make sure you have one photo and OIB number taken. With this card you can have the same advantages as Croatian students – e.g. subsidised set meals, reduced public transport fares, discounted entrance to museums, library membership, sports facilities.





When thinking about entertainment and events, Šibenik definitely offers a huge number of activities, excursions and things for everyone, regardless of tase or budget. You can be sure you will find everything here that a student could wish.

Šibenik, the oldest native Croatian city on the Adriatic, is located in the most protected natural harbour, in the centre of the eastern coast of the Adriatic Sea, at the mouth of the beautiful Krka River, at the sources of Croatia's rich history.

Today Šibenik has 47,274 inhabitants (2011) and is the capital as well as the cultural, educational, administrative and economic centre of the County of Šibenik and Knin.





If you plan sightseeing, you can do that practically on foot because the old city nucleus is focused in a relatively small area where you can enjoy and discover the city by yourself. It feels like walking into a magical setting of some movie that evokes past times.

You should definitely see the following monuments:

- The St. James Cathedral
- The fortification system (Fortresses of St. John, Michael, Nicholas and Barone)
- The City museum
- The National Theatre of Šibenik

and numerous other churches and squares that will leave you breathless.


















NATIONAL PARKS

Šibenik is situated in the vicinity of two national parks

Few places in the Mediterranean concentrate so much of what the modern tourist needs for complete relaxation in such a relatively small area, as do the Kornati Islands.

The Kornati are the densest island group in the Adriatic, with small fields, hidden oases of large-crowned pines and olives, quiet and sheltered bays that are ideal for escaping the noise and worry of civilization.

The Krka national park can be toured from the water, by road or on foot. It is possible

to take an organised boat trip and see Skradinski buk from Skradin, together with the islet of Visovac and the Roški slap cascade from the moorings above the largest cascade Skradinski buk.

Our institution has a strong and good cooperation with these national parks and we frequently organize field trips or workshops in their premises which is the ideal combination between nature and educational schemes.

Public transport Shopping

The main public transport in Šibenik are buses. Before you board a bus, you should buy your ticket from a newsagent or in the ticket offices at the Central bus station. Tickets can be bought from the bus driver as well, but this is more expensive. An economical solution is the monthly student pass. It can be bought at the Central bus station, address Draga 14.

Most shops in Šibenik are open on weekdays (Monday to Friday). Their opening hours differ regarding the season. Some are open on Saturdays but have shorter hours. However, malls and supermarkets open earlier (mostly between 7 and 8) and close later (between 20-22). During summer, they close even later.



There are three large malls where you can buy almost everything you might need such as clothes, food, books, medicine, electric appliances, sports equipment etc.








Šibenik has a hot mediterranean/ dry-summer subtropical climate that is mild with moderate seasonality. Summers are dry and hot due to the domination of subtropical high pressure systems while winters experience moderate temperatures and changeable, rainy weather due to the polar front.

In summer, the temperature can reach 36°C and in winter can fall -3°C.

The average temperature is 15.1 degrees Celsius (59.2°F).
